MOE's Red Tape Clutter Buster

We have a meeting with the Red Tape Clutter Buster project team from MOE with regard to the exemption process. In MOE's own words "The aim of this project is to reduce or stop those "red tape" activities that deliver little or no value; and to streamline and improve existing processes. In addition we are looking at resourcing forms and online templates. Our intention is to simplify forms, and retire ones that are low value."

This is an across-the-board project for MOE and is not solely focused on home education. We have been asked to participate and discuss the following questions as part of their process:

- What would the ideal process look like?
- What needs to be included in the process?
- How can forms, funding allocations, timing, etc, be improved to ensure the process works best?
- What types of activity is seen as entirely compliance driven for you?

Discount at Paper Plus Stores

After emailing a million Paper Plus stores I heard back from a select few who were more than happy to offer discounts to home educators! Each store will most likely ask for some form of ID (ie. exemption form or student ID card) in order to process the discount so remember to take something along – without ID to confirm you are home educating the discount may not be honoured.

The Paper Plus stores which offer discounts to home educators are:

- Highland Park (Auckland) 20%, can also access loyalty programme
- Sunnynook (Auckland) 20% off non-discounted stationery
- Papamoa (Tauranga) 20%
- Taupo 20% off non-discounted stationery, must join loyalty programme
- Rotorua (Tutanekai Street) 20% off books and stationery not already on sale
- Rototuna (Hamilton) see store directly for consideration and please let me know if you have problems
- The Base (Hamilton) 10% off non-discounted stationery
- Greymouth 10% through the loyalty programme

I'll keep you posted if any others come on board. If your local store is not on the list, feel free to pop in and ask if they would be interested in offering a discount to home educators. Let me know and I'll follow it up.
